



RENOVATION

Chantry Architects were asked to reorder and extend this 1930s detached dwelling. By making the existing spaces work more efficiently and extending to the limit of the Planning Authority's Local Plan, the original three bedroom house was transformed into a five bedroom dwelling with two reception room, a study and a feature kitchen, dining, family room opening out to the rear garden.

Chantry Architects were asked to extend and re-order a modest two storey cottage in a rural location. The existing cottage was retained and a new two storey extension added with a glass link to connect the new with the old. This glass link also allowed the new extension to be angled away from the existing cottage and fit within the constraints of the site. In order to preserve as much of the existing cottage and to retain the upstairs bedrooms, a new glass and timber element was constructed to provide first floor access to the extension. These two glass elements provide fantastic view across the open countryside and the rear garden.
